Liquid ignition

Can you recommend a cocktail to be served warm, so I can heat up the ladies on cold New York winter nights?

We recently discovered Voyant (\$22.99, parkaveliquor.com), a delicious liqueur with the cinnamon, clove, ginger, and vanilla flavors of chai tea. We asked our go-to master mixologist, Nick Mautone, to develop a hot drink with the cozy, rum-based libation. The result is sweet and creamy. Plus, while the alcohol will loosen things up, the caffeine will help keep your guest buzzing.

Chocolate Chai

- 1 cup hot brewed black tea
- 1 oz. Voyant Chai Cream liqueur
- 1 oz. Godiva Liqueur
- Whipped cream for garnish
- Mint chocolate chips for garnish

In a coffee mug, mix together the first three ingredients and stir well. Top with whipped cream and mint chocolate chips. Says Mautone: "This also makes a wonderful chilled cocktail—simply substitute two ounces of cold tea, shake with both liqueurs, and strain into a martini glass. Garnish it the same way."

I remove my shirts' collar stays prior to dry cleaning, and I need something to keep them organized. Suggestions?

The Stayclip will set you, and your collars, straight. The keychain-like holder magnetically attaches to a wall mount that can be stuck in or near your closet, keeping stays close at hand when not in use. It comes with four pairs in white plastic and an equal number in a more substantial tumbled chrome, both in the most common lengths: 2", 2.25", 2.75", and 3". High rollers: Grab a pair of solid-gold monogrammed stays with diamonds to trump them all (pictured, \$2,055 for a 2.75" pair).
